## AT THE OCCASION OF THE DECLARATION OF THE RESULTS FOR THE 2024 PRESIDENTIAL AND NATIONAL ASSEMBLY ELECTIONS

#### Good evening,

It is an extraordinary privilege and honour to stand before you to deliver this momentous announcement—the declaration of the official results of the November 2024 Presidential and National Assembly Elections.

This occasion marks the culmination of a journey that has tested our resilience as a nation, re-affirmed the strength of our democracy, and reinforced the enduring spirit of the Namibian people.

#### Fellow Namibians,

As Chairperson of the Electoral Commission of Namibia, I stand before you filled with humility, deeply aware of the significance of this event and its place in our nation's history. You will, no doubt, appreciate that conducting elections on a national scale is not only a complex process but it is also a huge responsibility. An assignment of this nature and magnitude comes with its own challenges: in the main administrative and logistical

challenges. We have had those challenges in this year's elections, too. But when such challenges occur, the right course of action is to always address them promptly and in the best interest of voters, democracy and the Namibian nation at large. In all our endeavours, the Commission has at all times sought to respond to all emerging challenges in this spirit. As we journeyed through the election process, we received feedback from our various electoral stakeholders. We took all feedback as positive, in that it not only gave us an opportunity to address matters immediately but such feedback also serves as input for future enhancement of the electoral processes. At this juncture, I take this opportunity to sincerely thank all Namibians and all our electoral stakeholders for your feedback, support, patience and resilience. The important thing is that Namibians have voted and, through their vote, have expressed their choice of leaders for the next five (5) years. We have been announcing the election results as they got finalised over the past few days; and will this evening announce the final outcomes. For all this we give the Honour and Glory to the Lord for His Grace, thank you Jesus.

#### **Announcement of results**

Fellow Namibians,

The turnout has been impressive.

The Electoral Commission of Namibia (ECN) monitored the voting that took place in the country and we are satisfied that such voting was conducted in an environment where the voters were free to elect candidates and political parties of their choice without fear, favour and/or intimidation. We are confident that the results that we are about to announce reflect the democratic will of the voters. The Commission, therefore, declares this as a free, fair, and credible election that has met legal requirements of the law and international best practices.

In terms of section 109 (1) the Electoral Act, I shall announce the total number of votes counted in respect of each candidate and in accordance with section 109 subsection (2) also declare the candidate who has accumulated the highest votes duly elected as President with effect from such dates determined by the Namibian Constitution. I will now proceed to declare the results.

#### Presidential election

Fifteen (15) candidates contested the presidential election. A total of **14 552** votes were rejected, representing **1.3%** of the total votes cast.

I, **Dr. Elsie Tuleingepo Nghikembua**, the Chairperson of the Commission, having determined the result of the election for the President, in accordance with the provisions of the Act, and Article 28(2)(b) of the Namibian Constitution hereby make known that a total number of **1 099 582** votes have been counted and that the votes counted have been recorded for –

I furthermore declare that **NETUMBO NDEMUPELILA NANDI-NDAITWAH** has been declared duly elected as President of the Republic of Namibia.

#### National Assembly elections

Twenty-one (21) political parties contested the elections. A total of **15 898** votes were rejected, representing **1.4%** of the total votes cast.

- I, **Dr. Elsie Nghikembua**, the Chairperson of the Commission, having ascertained the result of the election for the National Assembly in accordance with the provisions of the Act, hereby make know that-
  - (a) A total number of 1, 108 583 votes have been cast;
  - (b) A total number of 1, 092 685 Votes have been counted; and

The quota of votes per seat has been determined as 11,382

The quota determined in accordance with Schedule 4 of the Namibian Constitution is:
